SARASOTA, Fla. (UPI) - Karl A. Bickel, president of United Press from 1923 to 1935, who guided the news service into the morning newspaper field, feature syndication and news for radio, died Monday after a long illness. He was 90.

Bickel, a pioneer and innovator in global news gathering, resigned the presidency of UP, now United Press International, in 1935 at the age of 53, saying it was a young

not turn aside the historic watercourse, but they confined parts of it in a couple of small under-road conduits.

The Hawkins farmhouse, ample but in mid-19th Century cottage style, replaced an earlier structure on a massive stone foundation enclosing the original basement kitchen and dining room open at ground level on two sides. It was the main house on the 3,000 acres of Dr. Cadwallader Colden, medical man, scientist and public official, first surveyor-general and last lieutenant governor and acting governor of New York Province.

On those now fallow acres beyond I-84 Dr. Colden experimented with various crops to determine, for the good of other pioneers and succeeding generations, those most suitable to the soil and climate of this area. Those acres are important to Orange County argicultural history, likewise the canal that brought the harvest to farm headquarters for study and use.

active in community affairs. Bickel was the evangelist who convinced editors and publishers in scores of speeches before newspaper groups and in individual offices that their readers were as interested in stories about female labor building Moscow subways as in news of the state capital.

He planted the UP flag in countries that had never been exposed to anything but the dispatches of government-controlled agencies. That flag stood for a new kind of independent reporting.

He fought the world news cartel for 20 years and finally had the satisfaction of seeing UP's chief competitor, Associated Press. break out of the world news combine and adopt UP's independent methods.

Bickel joined United Press in San Francisco in 1907, the year it was founded, and the same year became its first manager in Portland, Ore.

## Mark Van Doren, writer, dies

Prize-winning poet and Columbia University professor who had a powerful influence on "Beat Generation" writers in the late 1940s, is dead at the age of 78.

Van Doren, whose wife and brother also were famous writers, died Sunday night at Charlotte Hungerford Hospital. He had undergone surgery at the hospital Friday for a circulatory problem.

A versatile and prolific writer since he was graduated from the University of Illinois in 1914, Van Doren won the Pulitzer in 1940 for his "Collected Poems."

His other books of poetry included "Spring Thunder and Other Poems" in 1924; "A Winter Diary and Other Poems" in 1935; "The Mayfield Deer" in 1941; "Spring Birth" in 1953; and "Morning Worship and Other Poems" in 1960.

He joined the staff of Columbia University in 1920 and remained there, teaching poetry and literature, until his retirement in 1959. His popularity on campus throughout his career was such that at times more than 200 persons enrolled for his classes.

Two "Beat Generation" writers he influenced were poet Allen Ginsberg and the late Jack Kerouac.

"He was one of the few gnostic professors at Columbia," said Ginsberg when told of Van Doren's death Monday. "Most of the other professors were interested in careers in literature and he was interested in illuminated wisdom. His being an influence on us was tolerance.

"He taught Kerouac Shakespeare and gave him an 'A.' Kerouac quit the Columbia football team in order to spend more time studying Shakespeare with Van Doren."

Ginsberg described Van Doren's

TORRINGTON, Conn. (UPI) poetry as "very mild, very wide, -Mark Van Doren, Pulitzer relatively plain American speech.'

At the age of 75, Van Doren, a slender, wiry man with a quick smile, published a volume of 75 poems titled "The Shining Place." It included the verse:

"The simplest words of all

"Are what I would love you with "Had I an angel's tongue

"Knew the swift sentences

"Whereof the world was made

"That day before you were." Van Doren's wife, Dorothy, was

an established novelist and critic. and his brother, the late Carl Van Doren, was a historian who won a Pulitzer Prize for his biography of Benjamin Franklin in 1939. Memorial services for Van

Doren, who lived on a 150-acre farm in Cornwall, Conn., a small village in the northwestern corner of the state, since 1923, will be held Wednesday at the First Church of Christ, Cornwall.
